John F. Kennedy

John F. Kennedy was president during the 1960's Civil Rights Movement. During his time in office, he did something no president had done before. He appointed black people to many federal positions. Also, he helped support the people who wanted desegregation, having decisive participation in the passing of laws to make sure all black people could vote and get a good education. President John F. Kennedy, however, didn't see his Civil Rights Act of 1963 become a law because he was assassinated in November 1963. The Civil Rights Act of 1963 was finally passed one year later and became the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which outlaws major forms of discrimination against African Americans and women. The law included in this Act ended segregation in schools, workplaces, restaurants, theaters, hotels and other public places.
