The truth behind shopping therapy

A

Have you ever bought something to celebrate getting good grades or passing an exam? Do you know what it feels like to find the perfect pair of shoes to complete a special outfit or to buy the latest must-have gadget? If you do, then you'll probably be the kind of person that engages in shopping therapy. According to one study, more than half of Americans admit to shopping and spending money to make themselves feel better. However, apart from that short-term, good feeling that comes from making a purchase, is shopping really good for us?

B

According to Janet Hunter, a psychologist, it can be. She says that as long as shopping doesn't get out of control, there are benefits to be had. Shopping can be a way to prepare for an important future event. Let's take a teenager who is going away to college. Buying the things he or she will need allows the individual to see themselves using the new products and therefore their new life. The mental picture of themselves cooking with a new saucepan, for example, will increase their self confidence and make the task less scary. As a result, they will be better prepared. Another example is buying an outfit for an important occasion such as starting a new job. If you picture yourself wearing the new outfit to work and looking good in it, you will be more confident and likely to perform better when you actually start.

But there are other benefits too. Some people say that shopping is like a sort of mini break. This is because shopping requires little concentration and can be quite relaxing. Jenna, a busy mum of three, says that she takes this kind of break from her family once a fortnight. 'Sometimes it's crazy at home,' she explains, 'so I leave the kids with my husband and go to the shops for some valuable me time. It's my chance to recharge my batteries and I can't do without it.'

D

However, what happens if shopping habits get out of control and shopping therapy becomes shopping tragedy? Some people become dependent on that fantastic feeling they get after purchasing something and before they know it, they are addicted to shopping. They buy things they don't need with money they don't have. They don't stop to consider the cost of their actions, but make purchases whenever they feel depressed, lonely, anxious or even bored. This can lead to financial problems and they get into debt. Just as any behaviour can become an addiction, so can shopping. Buyer beware!
