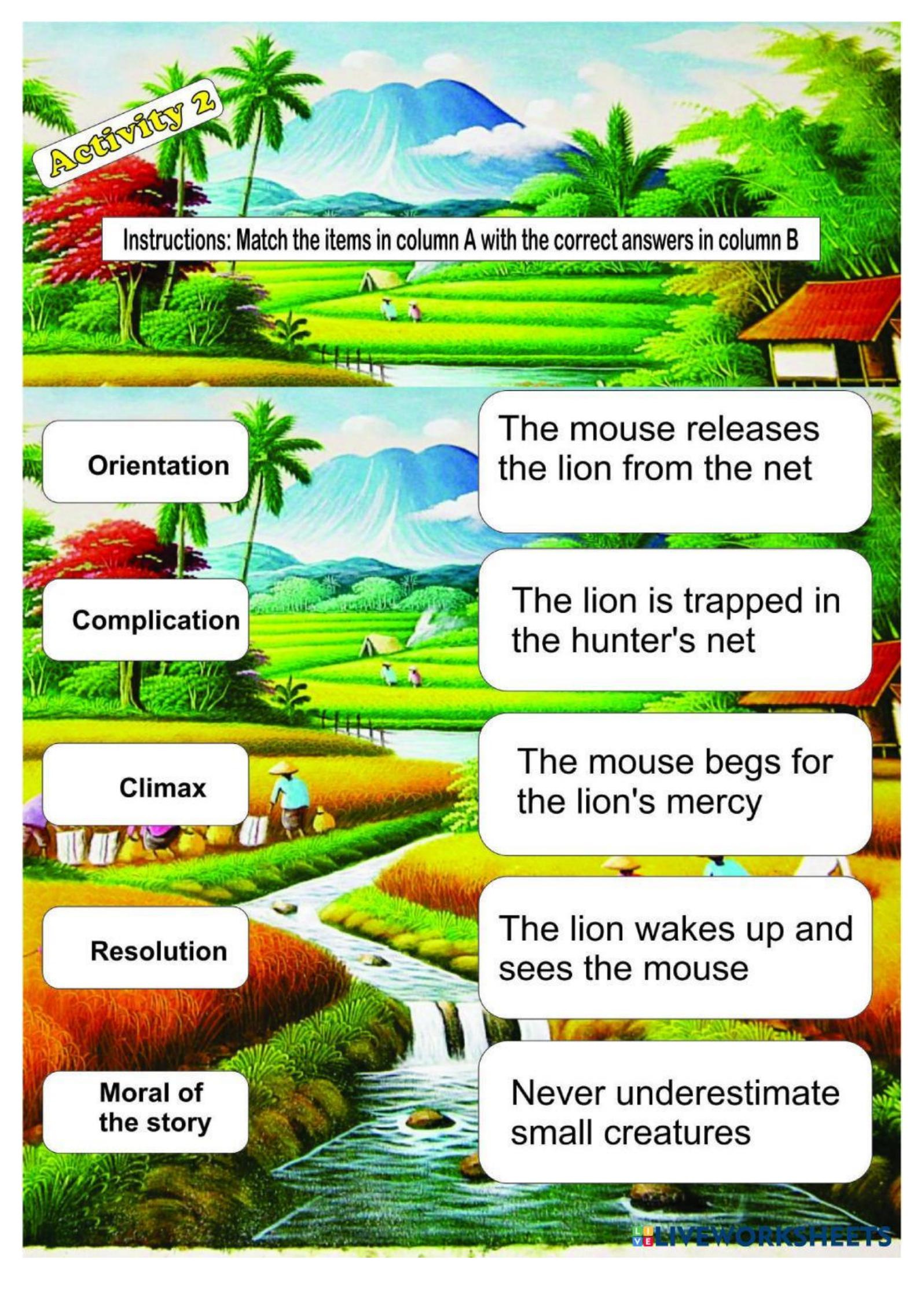
The mouse begged the lion to let him go. "Please let me go, and someday I will help you," said the mouse. The lion, feeling amused, decided to release the mouse.
