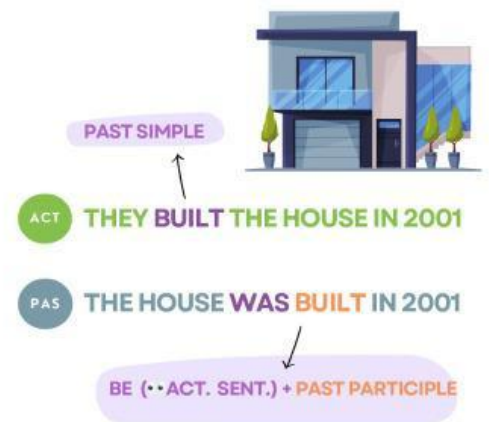
TO BE + PAST PARTICIPLE

Tips

- Verbo TO BE en el mismo tiempo del verbo principal de la oración activa.
- Se pone el VERBO PRINCIPAL en participio.
Ej.: I **play** the guitar - The guitar **is played**
- Si el objeto es un PRONOMBRE se cambia su forma a pronombre sujeto.
A: They will consider **me** for the job.
P: I will be considered for the job.

IMPERSONALES

Act: People say that children are afraid of ghosts.

- 1 It + be + participio + (that) + suj + verbo → P1: It is said that children are afraid of ghosts.
- 2 Someone/Something + be + participio + inf → P2: Children are said to be afraid of ghosts.

- Las oraciones impersonales suelen utilizar "reporting verbs" como: believe, claim, consider, expect, think, report, know, understand...

It is considered that he is the best candidate for the job.
