FURTHER REFLECTION:

Reported Speech Analysis of "Angel Down" by Lady Gaga:

Lady Gaga said that she confessed she was lost in the edge of social media. She mentioned that people were on their knees, taking a test to be loving and grateful.

She stated that shots had been fired on the street near the church where people used to meet, and she lamented that an angel was down while people just stood around.

Gaga expressed that she was a believer but saw life as a trial. She added that people were foolish and weaker, but she would rather save an angel than remain passive.

She asked why everyone didn't belong in the arms of the sacred and questioned why society pretended to be wrong. She wondered if young courage had faded.

The singer criticized the chaos of the world and demanded to know where the leaders were. She repeated that she would rather save an angel than accept the injustice happening around her.

Finally, she pleaded with listeners to save, hear, and catch the fallen angel, emphasizing the urgency of taking action instead of remaining indifferent.
