On September 26, 1983, Stanislav Petrov, a 44-year-old Lieutenant [lef'tenənt] Colonel ['kɔ:nl] in the Soviet Union's Air Defense Forces, 1) _____ saved the world from what would have been the end of modern-day civilization. So, if you were thinking, what else could it be if not a nuclear apocalypse [ə'pokəlɪps], you're right. At the time, the United States and the Soviet Union were still 2) _____ in a cold war, and tensions were high. On that fateful day, the Soviet Union's early warning system indicated that the United States had launched five nuclear missiles ['mɪsəɪl] at the Soviet Union. Petrov was the duty officer at the command centre that day and was tasked with determining whether or not the alert was accurate. He had to decide whether to report the alert to his superiors and potentially launch a retaliatory [rɪ'tælɪətərɪ] strike or trust his gut instinct that the alert was a false alarm. 3) _____, Petrov chose the latter.
