A contract is a legal agreement between two or more _____¹ (people or groups). Every contract contains different _____² (conditions) which state what each side must do. If the contract is in a written form, and somebody signs it, then usually that person must _____³ (meet) all the conditions, even if he or she has not read the full agreement. We can also say that the conditions are now _____⁴ (cannot be broken). If someone breaks the contract, for example if a person refuses to pay after receiving a service, the other person may decide to _____⁵ (take legal action) in a court of law. Sometimes, the parties may want to include some extra conditions in a contract after it has been signed. They can do this by adding an _____⁶ (extra section).
