So, you want to be a writer? Well, the first step in your journey is to start writing. You don't have to write for several hours at a time, but it is important that you write every day. You could write for between 30 minutes and 1 hour to begin with. It's a good idea to decide on a regular time and place for your writing and then to continue with this routine no matter what happens. Try to work somewhere quiet where you can be alone and then turn off the TV, your phone and your internet connection. That way you won't be tempted to stop writing. Some people listen to their favourite music while they work, but silence works better for me.

B

What about when you don't have any ideas? It's easy to worry about this and stop writing, but the best thing to do is to keep writing anyway. If you do this, eventually the words will come. The fact is, you can find ideas everywhere: in people, places and things. To stop yourself running low on ideas in the first place, read lots of books, because you can learn a lot from the way other writers create their stories.

C

While I was writing my first novel, I did a writing course. I found this was a great way to get the opinion of writers. I also learned a lot of valuable information about plot, setting, characters and dialogue during this course. It was a really good experience, and I advise all writers to do the same.

D

The next step is to send your work to agents and editors. But before you do that, you must make sure your work is perfect. Check it for mistakes and then give it to a friend to look at. After that, choose which agents or editors you want to send it to and write a letter. I've written six novels, but sending my work to my editor is always the most terrifying part. Good luck!
