Excuse me. How much are those laptops?

Well, this one is **cheaper than** that one. This one is £450 and that one is £699.

Language focus

Use **comparatives** to compare two people, places or things.

The doctor is **taller than** Ewan.

There are some rules to learn:

Add **er** to the end of adjectives with one syllable: **slow / slower**

Put **more** before adjectives of three or more syllables: **difficult / more difficult**

Sometimes, when an adjective is written **consonant + vowel + consonant**, double the final consonant: **sad / sadder**

When an adjective ends in **y**, change the **y** to an **i** and add **er**: **busy / busier**

There are some irregular adjectives that do not follow rules:

good better bad worse
