LESSON TWO: THIS, THAT, THESE, THOSE



WE USE "THIS" FOR ONE THING
THAT IS CLOSE TO YOU.
EXAMPLE: THIS IS MY PENCIL.
(THE PENCIL IS NEAR YOU)

WE USE "THAT" FOR ONE THING
THAT IS FAR AWAY FROM YOU.
EXAMPLE: THAT IS A TREE.
(THE TREE IS FAR FROM YOU)

WE USE "THESE" FOR MORE THAN
ONE THING THAT IS CLOSE TO YOU.
EXAMPLE: THESE ARE MY SHOES.
(THE SHOES ARE NEAR YOU.)

WE USE "THOSE" FOR MORE THAN
ONE THING THAT IS
FAR AWAY FROM YOU.
EXAMPLE: THOSE ARE MY BOOKS.
(THE BOOKS ARE FAR FROM YOU.)
