

### 1- KISS

Phonetic transcription: /kɪs/

Distinctive features for : /K/

This sound is produced with a strong puff of air  
Your vocal sound do not vibrate.

Book, Break, came.

Sentence sample:

He gave her a kiss.



### 2- CHICKEN

Phonetic transcription: /ˈtʃɪk.ɪn/

Distinctive features for: /K/

This sound is produced with a strong puff of air.  
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.

**Liquid, Quiet, Character.**

Sentence sample:

**I love eating chicken**



### 3- BOOK

Phonetic transcription: /bʊk/

Distinctive feature for /K/

The sound is produced with a strong puff of air.  
Your vocal sound do not vibrate

**Key, Sick, Became.**

Sentence sample:

**The book is expensive.**



#### 4- PIG

Phonetic transcription: /ptɪg/

Distinctive feature for: /G/  
This sound does not have an aspirate quality.  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.

**Forget, Bag, Egg.**

Sentence sample:

**I have a pig.**



#### 5- LEAGUE

Phonetic transcription: /li:ɡ/

Distinctive feature for: /G/  
This sound does not have an aspirate quality.  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.

**Get, go, give.**

Sentence sample:

**The champion league is coming soon.**



#### 6- GOOD

Phonetic transcription: /ɡʊd/

Distinctive feature for: /G/  
This sound does not have an aspirate quality.  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.

**Flag, again, gas.**

Sentence sample:

**It is a good day to learn something new.**



## 7- FAN

Phonetic transcription: /fæn/

Distinctive feature for: /F/  
Do not stop the flow of air.  
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.  
**Force, refer, free.**

Sentence simple:  
**The fan is big.**



## 8- COFFEE

Phonetic transcription: /'kɑːfi/

Distinctive feature for: /F/  
Produce the sound by forcing air out through the opening  
Do not stop the flow of air.  
**Stuff, phone, fun.**

Sentence sample:  
**I like drinking coffee.**



## 9- PHONE

Phonetic transcription: /fəʊn/

Distinctive feature for: /F/  
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.  
**Food, chief, afford.**

Sentence sample:  
**The phone is really advanced.**



## 10- DRIVER

Phonetic transcription: /ˈdraɪ.və/

Distinctive feature for /V/

Lightly but firmly, touch the upper teeth with the inner part.  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.

**Over, clever, verb.**

Sentence sample:

**I am a good driver.**



## 11- VOICE

Phonetic transcription: /vɔɪs/

Distinctive feature for /V/

Produce the sound by forcing air out through the opening.  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.

**Village, brave, give.**

Sentence sample:

**May you moderate your tone of voice?**



## 12- WAVE

Phonetic transcription: /weɪv/

Distinctive Feature for /V/

Do not stop the flow of air  
Your vocal sound should vibrate.

**Above, cave, save.**

Sentence sample:

**I really enjoy watching the waves.**



### 13- THANK

Phonetic transcription: /θæŋk/

Distinctive feature for: /θ/

The air is forced put through the narrow opening between your teeth and tongue.

**Nothing, truth, bath.**

Sentence sample:

**Thank you so much for your attention.**



### 14- MATH

Phonetic transcription: /mæθ/

Distinctive feature for: /θ/

Your vocal cords do not vibrate.

**Path, thought, think.**

Sentence sample:

**My mom is intelligent at math.**



### 15- BATHROOM

Phonetic transcription: /'bæθ.rʊm/

Distinctive feature for: /θ/

Lightly place your tongue tip between your upper and lower front teeth. Your vocal cords do not vibrate.

**Both, tenth, teeth.**

Sentence sample:

**Maria should clean the bathroom today.**



## 16- FATHER

Phonetic transcription: /'fɑːðə/

Distinctive feature for: **ð**

Say **ð** with less force than you use for **θ**  
your vocal cords should vibrate.

**Them, mother, other.**

Sentence sample:

**My father is a very responsible person**



## 17- THEY

Phonetic transcription: /ðeɪ/

Distinctive feature for: **/ð/**

Your vocal cords should vibrate

**This, another, that.**

Sentence sample:

**They want to buy an umbrella.**



## 18- MOTHER

Phonetic transcription: /ˈmʌð.ə/

Distinctive feature for: /ð/  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.  
**Their, those, the.**



Sentence sample:  
**I am going to go to Guatemala with my mother.**

## 19- SICK

Phonetic transcription: /sɪk/

Distinctive feature for: /S/  
The air escapes with a hiss.  
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.  
**So, missing, kiss.**



Sentence sample:  
**My boss is really sick today.**

## 20- SEE

Phonetic transcription: /si:/

Distinctive feature for: /S/  
The air escapes with a hiss.  
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.  
**Seven, race, cent.**



Sentence sample:  
**It is amazing to see you again.**

## 21- MISSING

Phonetic transcription: /'mɪs.ɪŋ/

Distinctive feature for: /S/  
Your vocal cords do not vibrate.  
**Safe, sound, some.**

Sentence sample:  
**Who is missing tonight?**



## 22- CRAZY

Phonetic transcription: /'kreɪ.zi/

Distinctive feature for: /Z/  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.  
The air escapes with a buzzing sound.  
**Zero, zoo, cries.**

Sentence sample:  
**I think you are crazy my friend.**



## 23- ZOO

Phonetic transcription: /zu:/

Distinctive feature for: /z/  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.  
**Dizzy, zip, rise.**

Sentence sample:  
**I visited a zoo with my family.**



## 24- ZINC

Phonetic transcription: /zɪŋk/

Distinctive feature for: /z/  
Your vocal cords should vibrate.  
**Freezer, zone, zeal.**

Sentence sample:

**Zinc is often used to prevent rust on metal surfaces.**
