

Sound /k/

1. Cat

Phonetic transcription: /kæt/

Distinctive features: Plosive, velar, voiceless.

Sentence sample: The cat is sleeping on the couch.

2. Baking

Phonetic transcription: /'beɪ.kɪŋ/

Distinctive features: Plosive, velar, voiceless.

Sentence: She enjoys baking cakes on weekends.

3. Snack

Phonetic transcription: /snæk/

Distinctive features: Plosive, velar, voiceless.

Sentence: I grabbed a snack before heading to class.

Sound /g/

4. Go

Phonetic transcription: /gou/

Distinctive features: Plosive, velar, voiced.

Sentence: We need to go to the store.

5. Agree

Phonetic transcription: /ə'gri:/

Distinctive features: Plosive, velar, voiced.

Sentence: They agree on the decision.

6. Bag

Phonetic transcription: /bæg/

Distinctive features: Plosive, velar, voiced.

Sentence: She left her bag on the table.

## Sound /f/

### 7. Fish

Phonetic transcription: /fɪʃ/

Distinctive features: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

Sentence: He caught a big fish in the lake.

### 8. Office

Phonetic transcription: /ˈɒ.fɪs/

Distinctive features: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

Sentence: She works in an office downtown.

### 9. Half

Phonetic transcription: /hæf/

Distinctive features: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

Sentence: He ate half of the sandwich.

Sound /v/

10. Voice

Phonetic transcription: /vɔɪs/

Distinctive features: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

Sentence: She has a beautiful voice.

11. Loving

Phonetic transcription: /'lʌ.vɪŋ/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental, voiceless.

Sentence: He is a loving father.

12. Leave

Phonetic transcription: /li:v/

Distinctive features: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless.

Sentence: We will leave in ten minutes.

## Sound /θ/

13. Think

Phonetic

transcription: /θɪŋk/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental,

voiceless.

14. Author

Phonetic transcription: /'ɔ:.θə/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental,  
voiceless.

Sentence: She is a famous author.

15. Teeth

Phonetic transcription: /ti:θ/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental,  
voiceless.

Sentence: He brushed his teeth before bed.

## Sound /ð/ (as in "this")

16. This

Phonetic transcription: /ðɪs/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental, voiced

Sentence: This is my favorite book.

17. Rather

Phonetic transcription: /ˈræ.ðə/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental, Voiced

Sentence: I would rather stay home.

18. Bathe

Phonetic transcription: /beɪð/

Distinctive features: Fricative, interdental, Voiced

Sentence: She likes to bathe in the evening.

## Sound /s/

19. Sun

Phonetic transcription: /sʌn/

Distinctive features: Fricative, alveolar  
Voiceless.

Sentence: The sun is shining brightly.

20. Listen

Phonetic transcription: /'li.sən/

Distinctive features: Fricative, alveolar  
Voiceless.

Sentence: Please listen carefully.

21. Glass

Phonetic transcription: /glæs/

Distinctive features: Fricative, alveolar  
Voiceless.

Sentence: The glass is full of water.

## Sound /z/

22. Zoo

Phonetic transcription: /zu:/

Distinctive features: Fricative, alveolar  
Voiced.

Sentence: We visited the zoo yesterday.

23. Music

Phonetic transcription: /'mju:zɪk/

Distinctive features: Fricative, alveolar  
Voiced.

Sentence: I love listening to music.

24. Buzz

Phonetic transcription: /bʌz/

Distinctive features: Fricative, alveolar  
Voiced.

Sentence: The bees buzz around the flowers.
