

1. Cat



Phonetic transcription: /kæt/

Distinctive features for /k/: Plosive, velar, voiceless

Sentence sample: The cat was sleeping on the couch.

2. Baking



Phonetic transcription: /'beɪkɪŋ/

Distinctive features for /k/: Plosive, velar, voiceless

Sentence sample: She is baking a delicious cake right now.

3. Sock



Phonetic transcription: /sɒk/

Distinctive features for /k/: Plosive, velar, voiceless

Sentence sample: I will buy a new pair of socks tomorrow.

4. Goat



Phonetic transcription: /gəʊt/

Distinctive features for /g/: Plosive, velar, voiceless

Sentence sample: The goat jumped over the fence.

5. Bigger



Phonetic transcription: /ˈbɪgə-/

Distinctive features for /g/: Plosive, velar, voiceless

Sentence sample: This house has been getting bigger every year.

6. Dog



Phonetic transcription: /dɒg/

Distinctive features for /g/: Plosive, velar, voiceless

Sentence sample: He had a dog when he was a child.

7. Fish

Phonetic transcription: /fɪʃ/

Distinctive features for /f/: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless

Sentence sample: I usually eat fish for dinner.



8. Coffee

Phonetic transcription: /'kɒfi/

Distinctive features for /f/: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless

Sentence sample: She was drinking coffee while reading.



9. Leaf

Phonetic transcription: /li:f/

Distinctive features for /f/: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless

Sentence sample: The leaf fell from the tree last autumn.



10. Van

Phonetic transcription: /væn/



Distinctive features for /v/: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless

Sentence sample: They are driving a blue van across the country.

11. River

Phonetic transcription: /ˈrɪvə/



Distinctive features for /v/: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless

Sentence sample: The river has flowed through this valley for centuries.

12. Love

Phonetic transcription: /lʌv/



Distinctive features for /v/: Fricative, labiodental, voiceless

Sentence sample: He loved that book when he was younger.

13. Think

Phonetic transcription: /θɪŋk/

Distinctive features for /θ/: Fricative, dental, voiceless

Sentence sample: She thinks about her future a lot.



14. Author

Phonetic transcription: /ˈɔːθə/

Distinctive features for /θ/: Fricative, dental, voiceless

Sentence sample: This author wrote several bestsellers.



15. Bath

Phonetic transcription: /bæθ/

Distinctive features for /θ/: Fricative, dental, voiceless

Sentence sample: He was taking a bath when the phone rang.





16. This

Phonetic transcription: /ðɪs/

Distinctive features for /ð/: Fricative, dental, voiced

Sentence sample: This is the best day of my life!



17. Brother

Phonetic transcription: /ˈbrʌðə/

Distinctive features for /ð/: Fricative, dental, voiced

Sentence sample: My brother will visit us next weekend.



18. Breathe

Phonetic transcription: /briːð/

Distinctive features for /ð/: Fricative, dental, voiced

Sentence sample: Take a deep breath before you speak.

19. Sun

Phonetic transcription: /sʌn/



Distinctive features for /s/: Fricative, alveolar, voiceless

Sentence sample: The sun rises in the east.

20. Lesson

Phonetic transcription: /ˈlesən/



Distinctive features for /s/: Fricative, alveolar, voiceless

Sentence sample: She was teaching a lesson when the bell rang.

21. Bus

Phonetic transcription: /bʌs/



Distinctive features for /s/: Fricative, alveolar, voiceless

Sentence sample: They will take the bus to school tomorrow.

22. Zebra



Phonetic transcription: /'zi:brə/

Distinctive features for /z/: Fricative, alveolar, voiced

Sentence sample: The zebra ran across the savanna.

23. Easy



Phonetic transcription: /'i:zi/

Distinctive features for /z/: Fricative, alveolar, voiced

Sentence sample: It has always been easy for him to learn languages.

24. Buzz



Phonetic transcription: /bʌz/

Distinctive features for /z/: Fricative, alveolar, voiced

Sentence sample: A bee was buzzing around my head all morning.
