

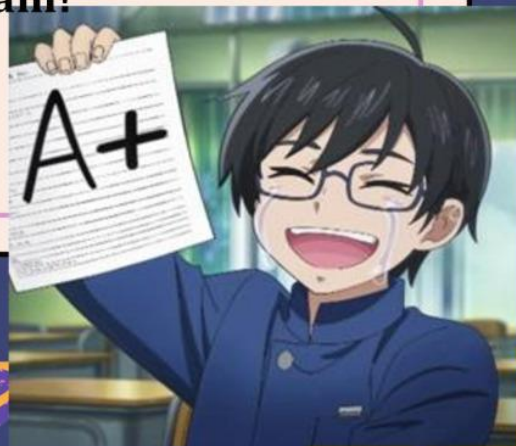
Word: Luck

Phonetic Transcription: /lʌk/

Distinctive Features for /k/:

Velar, voiceless, plosive

**Sentence Example: I wish you good
luck on your exam!**



Word: Take

Phonetic Transcription: /teɪk/

Distinctive Features for /k/:

Velar, voiceless, plosive

Sentence Example: Please take a seat.



Word: Key

Phonetic Transcription: /ki:/

Distinctive Features for /k/:

Velar, voiceless, plosive

Sentence Example: He lost his key on the way home.



Word: Bigger

Phonetic Transcription: /'bɪg.ə-/

Distinctive Features for /g/:

Velar, voiced, plosive

Sentence Example: This house is bigger than the old one.



Word: Garden

Phonetic Transcription: /'gɑ:r.dən/

Distinctive Features for /g/:

Velar, voiced, plosive

Sentence Example: The flowers in the garden are blooming.



Word: Great

Phonetic Transcription: /greɪt/

Distinctive Features for /g/:

Velar, voiced, plosive

Sentence Example: She gave a great speech.



Word: Funny

Phonetic Transcription: /'fʌn.i/

Distinctive Features for /f/:

Labiodental, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: That joke was
really funny.**



Word: Fast

Phonetic Transcription: /fæst/

Distinctive Features for /f/:

Labiodental, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: He ran very fast in
the race.**



Phoneme: /F/

Word: Fish

Phonetic Transcription: /fɪʃ/

Distinctive Features for /f/:

Labiodental, voiceless, fricative

Sentence Example: She caught a big fish in the lake.



Word: Love

Phonetic Transcription: /lʌv/

Distinctive Features for /v/:

Labiodental, voiced, fricative

Sentence Example: She feels deep love for her family.



Word: River

Phonetic Transcription: /'rɪv.ə/

Distinctive Features for /v/:

Labiodental, voiced, fricative

**Sentence Example: The river flows
through the valley.**



Word: Voice

Phonetic Transcription: /vɔɪs/

Distinctive Features for /v/:

Labiodental, voiced, fricative

**Sentence Example: She has a beautiful
voice.**



Word: Teeth

Phonetic Transcription: /ti:θ/

Distinctive Features for /θ/:

Interdental, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: Brush your teeth
twice a day.**



Word: Nothing

Phonetic Transcription: /'nʌθ.ɪŋ/

Distinctive Features for /θ/:

Interdental, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: I have nothing to
do today.**



Phoneme: /θ/

Word: Think

Phonetic Transcription: /θɪŋk/

Distinctive Features for /θ/:

Interdental, voiceless, fricative

Sentence Example: I think it's going to rain today.



Word: Together

Phonetic Transcription: /tə'geð.ə/

Distinctive Features for /ð/:

Interdental, voiced, fricative

Sentence Example: We will go to the party together.



Word: That

Phonetic Transcription: /ðæt/

Distinctive Features for /ð/:

Interdental, voiced, fricative

Sentence Example: That is my favorite movie.



Phoneme: /ð/

Phonetic Transcription: /ðɪs/

Distinctive Features for /ð/:

Interdental, voiced, fricative

Sentence Example: This book is very interesting



Word: House

Phonetic Transcription: /haʊs/

Distinctive Features for /s/:

Alveolar, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: My house is near
the park.**



Word: Salt

Phonetic Transcription: /sɔlt/

Distinctive Features for /s/:

Alveolar, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: Please pass me the
salt.**



Word: Sun

Phonetic Transcription: /sʌn/

Distinctive Features for /s/:

Alveolar, voiceless, fricative

**Sentence Example: The sun is shining
brightly today.**



Word: Crazy

Phonetic Transcription: /'kreɪ.zi/

Distinctive Features for /z/:

Alveolar, voiced, fricative

**Sentence Example: That was a crazy
idea!**



Word: Music

Phonetic Transcription: /'mjuː.zɪk/

Distinctive Features for /z/:

Alveolar, voiced, fricative

Sentence Example: I love listening to classical music.



Word: Zero

Phonetic Transcription: /'ziə.rʊ/ (or /'zer.ʊ/ in some accents)

Distinctive Features for /z/:

Alveolar, voiced, fricative

Sentence Example: The temperature dropped to zero degrees.
