


2 LIZARD



PHONETIC TRANSCRIPTION

[ˈlɪzəd]

Voiced.

PLACE OF ARTICULATION

Alveolar

An alveolar sound is made when the tip of the tongue touches or is just below the alveolar ridge. The alveolar ridge is the bumpy part of the roof of the mouth that is just behind the top teeth.

MANNER OF ARTICULATION

Fricative

A fricative is produced by creating a narrow passageway for air to escape the mouth.
