


Tag Questions, or Question tags, are used at the end of statements to turn the statements into questions. We usually use question tags to confirm something that we believe to be true or to invite the listener to agree or disagree with a statement.

**Verb Tense****Present be****+ sentence → - tag**

She is American, isn't she?

Present simple

You study English, don't you?

Past simple

You were at home, weren't you?

Past continuous

Tom was watching TV, wasn't he?

Present Perfect

He has written 5 letters, hasn't he?

Past Perfect

You had had lunch, hadn't you?

Will

He'll read this book, won't he?

Modal Verbs

He can read this book, can't he?

- sentence → + tag

She isn't American, is she?

You don't study English, do you?

You weren't at home, were you?

Tom wasn't watching TV, was he?

He hasn't written 5 letters, has he?

You hadn't had lunch, had you?

He won't read this book, will he?

He can't read this book, can he?

Use the same auxiliary verb as in the main sentence. If there is no auxiliary verb, use do for present and did for past.

Use a comma before the question tag and a subject pronoun at the end (I, you, he, she, it, we, you, they).

- You are his brother, aren't you?
- He will be there, won't he?
- You work here, don't you?
