

First Conditional

The first conditional is used when there is a real possibility that a condition will happen in the future.

IF CLAUSE OR CONDITION = PRESENT SIMPLE <i>If it rains,</i>	MAIN CLAUSE OR RESULT = WILL <i>he will bring his umbrella</i>
MAIN CLAUSE OR RESULT = WILL <i>He will bring his umbrella</i>	IF CLAUSE OR CONDITION = PRESENT SIMPLE <i>if it rains.</i>
