How to know when to use "like".

We use "like" when we compare things, and nothing (-) when we define something.

If the end of a sentence contains a **noun**, we use "like".

If the end of a sentence contains an **adjective**, we don't write anything (-).

Examples

That cloud looks like a **dragon**.

This blanket feels **soft**.

This candy tastes like **melon**.

The cake smells **nice**.

The candle smells like **flowers**.
