## How to know when to use “like”.

We use “like” when we compare things, and nothing (-) when we define something.

If the end of a sentence contains a noun, we use “like”.

If the end of a sentence contains an adjective, we don’t write anything (-).

## Examples

That cloud looks like a dragon.

This blanket feels soft.

This candy tastes like melon.

The cake smells nice.

The candle smells like flowers.
