

Past Continuous

Grammar – past continuous [was / were + ing]

Affirmative: I was doing / You were doing / He/she/it was doing / We were doing / You were doing (*plural*) / They were doing

Negative: I was not doing / You were not doing / He/she/it was not doing / We were not doing / You were not doing / They were not doing

Question: Was I doing? / Were you doing? / Was he/she/it doing? Were we doing? / Were you doing? / Were they doing?

We can use it to talk about a specific point in time. We use the past continuous to talk about past events which went on for a period of time.

We use it when we want to emphasize the continuing process of an activity or the period of that activity. (If we just want to talk about the past event as a simple fact, we use the past simple.)

- While I was driving home, Peter was trying desperately to contact me.
- Were you expecting any visitors?
- Sorry, were you sleeping?
- I was just making some coffee.
- I was thinking about him last night.
- In the 1990s few people were using mobile phones.

We often use it to describe a "background action" when something else happened.

- I was walking in the street when I suddenly fell over.
- She was talking to me on the phone and it suddenly went dead.
- They were still waiting for the plane when I spoke to them.
- The company was declining rapidly before he took charge.
- We were just talking about it before you arrived.
- I was making a presentation in front of 500 people when the microphone stopped working.

Past Simple

Grammar – past simple [+ed / irregular verb form]

Affirmative: I played / You played / He/she/it played / We played / You played (*plural*) / They played

Negative: I did not play / You did not play / He/she/it did not play / We did not play / You did not play / They did not play

Question: Did I play? / Did you play? / Did he/she/it play? / Did we play? / Did you play? / Did they play?

Functions and examples

We use the past simple to talk about actions and states which we see as completed in the past.

We can use it to talk about a specific point in time.

- She came back last Friday.
- I saw her in the street.
- They didn't agree to the deal.

It can also be used to talk about a period of time.

- She lived in Tokyo for seven years.
- They were in London from Monday to Thursday of last week.
- When I was living in London, I went to all the jazz concerts I could.

You will often find the past simple used with time expressions such as these:

- Yesterday
- three weeks ago
- last year
- in 2002
- from March to June
- for a long time
- for 6 weeks
- in the 1980s
- in the last century
- in the past
