# POSSESSIVE: -'S and -S'



**singular nouns:** add -'s

example: boy → boy's




The **boy's** bicycle is blue.



*It belongs to  
the boy.*

**plural nouns:** add -s'

example: boys → boys'



The **boys'** bicycles are blue.



*They belong to  
the boys.*

**some irregular plural nouns:** add -'s

example: children → children's



The **children's** bicycles are blue.



*They belong to  
the children.*


