Use **be going to** + base form to express future plans.

I'm
You're
He's
She's
We're
They're

going to relax this weekend.

I'm
You're
He's
She's
We're
They're

not going to go camping this weekend.

Contractions

is not going / 's not going / isn't going
are not going / 're not going / aren't going

Yes / no questions

Are you going to sleep late tomorrow? Yes, I am. / No, I'm not.
Is she going to travel to Europe? Yes, she is. / No, she isn't.
Are we going to be on time? Yes, we are. / No, we aren't.
