| 2. FIRST CONDITIONAL | B) REAL and POSSIBLE SITUATIONS. Also, for PROMISES. |
| 3. SECOND CONDITIONAL | C) FACTS and GENERAL TRUTHS |
| 4. THIRD CONDITIONAL | D) HYPOTHETICAL and UNUSUAL SITUATIONS that are UNLIKELY or IMPOSSIBLE to happen. Also, for ADVICES. |

How do we FORM these conditionals?

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| 1. ZERO CONDITIONAL | A) If + present simple → present simple. |
| 2. FIRST CONDITIONAL | B) If + past perfect → would have + past participle. |
| 3. SECOND CONDITIONAL | C) If + present simple → will + infinitive. |
| 4. THIRD CONDITIONAL | D) If + past simple → would + infinitive. |
