For film buffs, the Cannes Film Festival is now the world's most widely publicized film gathering that is too good to miss. Held annually in France, it not only offers filmmakers of all genres a rendezvous to showcase their new artistic works, but also does great honour to cinematographic achievements.

The origins of the Cannes Film Festival date back to 1938 when the French government decided to set up an international cinematic festival with support from the American and British counterparts. At that time, the Venice Film Festival was the only platform for filmmakers on a global scale, but its jury's decisions were heavily influenced by fascist groups. This marked bias caused outrage among a vast audience in other European countries and the U.S. One year later, the city of Cannes was selected as the location for the new festival. However, in the middle of screenings, the festival was called off due to the outbreak of the Second World War. Not until 1947 was the festival relaunched with 21 countries presenting their films at the first edition. Today, the festival has remained faithful to its founding purpose and ushered emerging directors into the film industry at an international level.
