A mosaic is a special kind of art where a surface is covered by small pieces of coloured glass or stone. The pieces – or 'tiles' – are placed carefully and stuck together tightly. They can make amazing designs and pictures.

MOSAICS fascinating facts!

Mosaics have been found from many different times and in many different countries.

- Some of the earliest known mosaics are from Western Asia. They are over 4,000 years old.
- The two biggest mosaic museums in the world are in Turkey.
- Mosaics were very popular in Roman times. They were strong, easy to clean and waterproof, so the Romans often used them on the floors of big buildings.
- One of the most famous mosaic artists in the 20th century was Antoni Gaudi, from Barcelona in Spain. His mosaics can be seen all over the city – on houses, big buildings and in parks. Mosaic souvenirs are very popular in Barcelona!
- The biggest mosaic in the world today is on a wall in Hanoi, Vietnam. It is around 6.5 km long. It is made of stone tiles from a local village.
- A French street artist, known as Invader, has become famous for his mosaics on walls in cities all over the world. They show characters from 1970s video games!



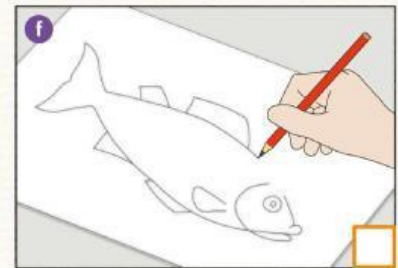
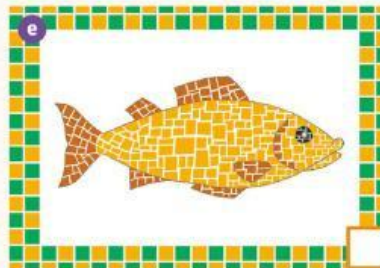
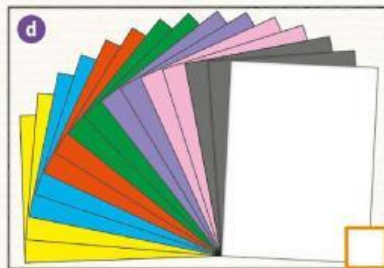
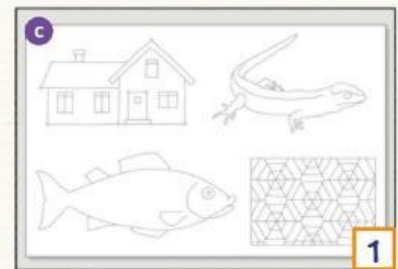
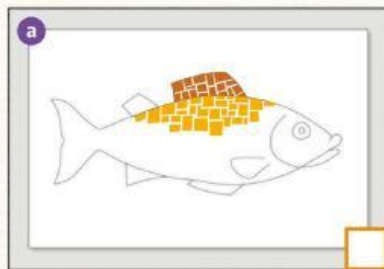

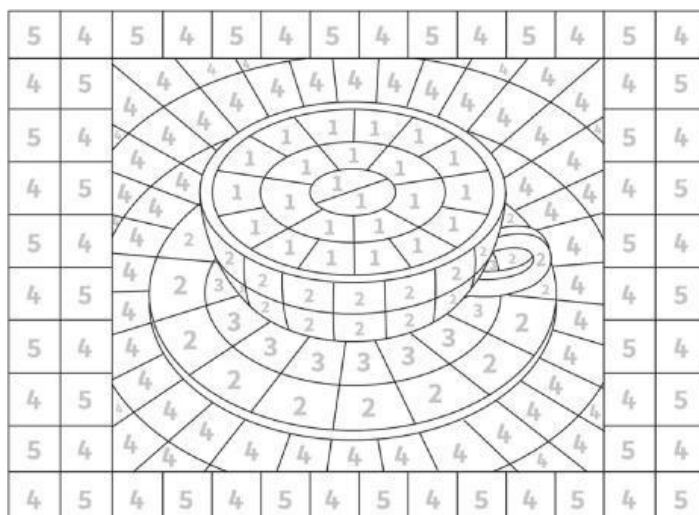

- 4 Cut the paper into small pieces to make your 'tiles'.
- 5 Stick your paper 'tiles' onto your design. Leave a little white space between the 'tiles'.
