The life of Joyce Carol Vincent: A tragic tale of popularity to obscurity to fame

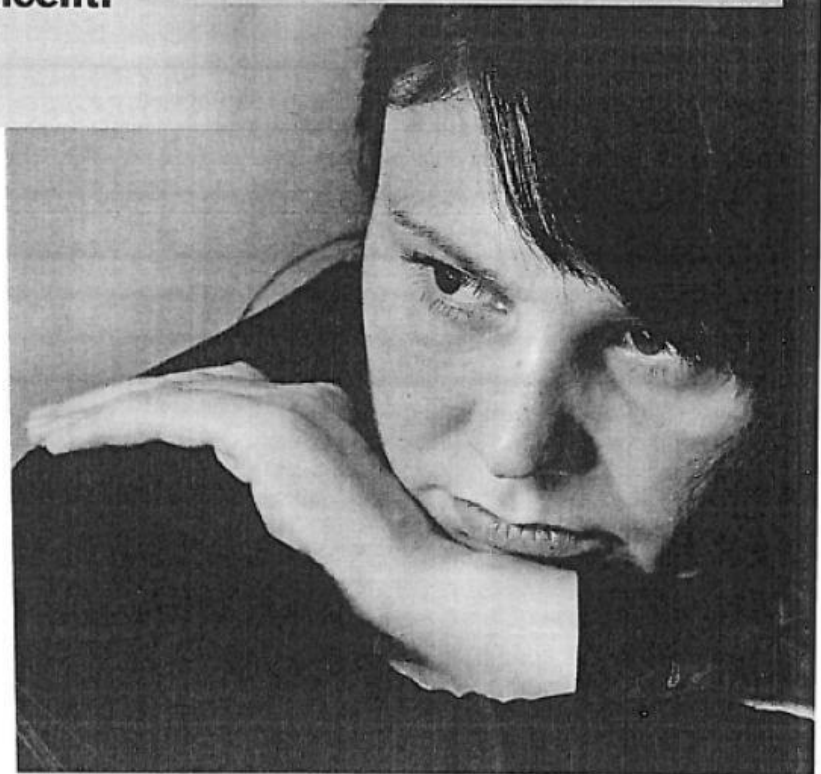
Scriptwriter and director Carol Morley's latest film *Dreams of a Life*, a nominee for the Grierson Award for best documentary at the 2011 London Film Festival, tells a difficult tale.

1 As a result of the film, the attractive Whitney Houston lookalike is sure to achieve celebrity status, if not to become a legend.

On 25th January 2006, council officials arrived at a dingy one-roomed flat in Wood Green, London. **2** On entering the flat, they were met with a disturbing sight: a decomposed skeleton was lying on the couch with the television still on. Forensic tests showed that the skeleton was of a woman in her late thirties who had died almost three years earlier; dental records and an old holiday photo helped to identify the woman as Joyce Carol Vincent. The cause of her death, however, still remains a mystery.

On hearing the story of the unfortunate woman, director Carol Morley was intrigued to find out more about who she was. She was fascinated by how someone could die in this way and for nobody to notice she was missing. **3** During her investigation, she managed to track down several of Joyce's former friends, colleagues and boyfriends. They all reacted with disbelief on hearing about Joyce's fate. They all described her as a very popular, outgoing person who had always been surrounded by other people. A few years before her death, she had been climbing up the career ladder in her high-paying job at a reputable accounting firm. **4** Neither could they imagine that the fun-loving Joyce they once knew had been so alone during her last days that her absence hadn't been noticed by anyone.

The more Morley found out about Joyce, the more she was convinced that she had to make a film about her life. **5** In the 1980s, she was friends with a musician called Kirk Thorne who used to record punk sensation Captain Sensible in his



recording studio. In this same studio, he had also recorded Joyce who dreamt of becoming a singer one day. In her youth, Joyce had also dated a baronet, an MP and Alistair Abrahams, the former tour manager of a famous soul singer. Together, they even shook hands with Nelson Mandela at a concert given in his honour, and Joyce appears on the broadcasted version of the concert watched by millions in 60 countries. Clearly, she had been a woman with good connections.

Morley's documentary plays tribute to this extraordinary woman and her tragic story. **6** The film brings home to us how being indifferent to those around us – friends, relatives, neighbours or just passers-by – can lead to exceptionally sad circumstances. Having said that, Morley's point is not to depress her audience, but to set alarm bells ringing. Now, more than ever, we need to nurture our relationships; we need to re-establish the concept of community spirit and keep Joyce's memory alive.
