Ending Extreme Poverty – Many families in rural areas still live on less than Q10 per day, struggling to afford food and shelter.

Fair Sharing of Wealth and Resources – In cities like Guatemala City, wealthy zones have modern services while nearby communities lack clean water and electricity.

Protecting the Planet – Forests in Petén are being destroyed by illegal logging and agriculture.

Pollution and Industrial Impact – Factories near rivers like the Motagua often dump waste, harming ecosystems and communities.

Fighting Hunger and Malnutrition – In places like Quiché and Alta Verapaz, many children suffer from chronic malnutrition.

Unemployment and Migration Issues – With few job opportunities, many Guatemalans migrate to the U.S. in search of work.

Keeping Children Safe and Supported – In some communities, children work in the streets or markets instead of attending school.

Investing in New Opportunities – Some regions, like the Western Highlands, see very little government or private investment.

Promoting Equality and Protecting Rights – Indigenous groups often face discrimination and lack access to fair legal representation.
