Listen to This!

Do you ever wonder why your parents tell you to turn the volume down when you're **(0) listening** to loud music? It's important to listen to music and other sounds at the right volume because if you don't, it can hurt your ears!

Sound travels in waves. These waves can move (1) or slowly, depending on their frequency. The type of sound that these waves make when they move is called pitch.

If a sound wave moves slowly, the pitch is low, like the sound of a bass (2)

If a sound wave moves quickly, the pitch is high, like the sound of a (3) or violin.

Sometimes, a sound has a frequency that is too high or too low for people to hear.

We measure frequency in hertz. The range that humans can hear is 20-20,000 hertz (Hz).

(4) can hear sounds from 75 to 200,000 Hz! Dolphins can hear things we can't.

We measure the volume of a sound in decibels (dB). The sound of people whispering is about 30 dB, and the sound of a jet engine is about 140 dB! The max output of most phones and digital music players is (5) 70 and 90 dB, which is really loud! Try to keep the volume at 50 dB instead. Your ears will thank you!

Rocks From Space

Some rocks are not from Earth at all, but from way out in space. Large space rocks that orbit around the Sun are called asteroids. Smaller rocks that orbit around the Sun are called meteoroids. If an asteroid or meteoroid travels through the Earth's atmosphere and lands on Earth's surface it is called a meteorite. When they land, they can create large hollow areas in the ground called craters. Meteorites land on Earth all the time. Did you know around 500 meteorites bigger than footballs hit Earth each year? The good thing is most of them fall into the ocean. Smaller ones the size of pebbles tend to fall on land. Minerals are **natural occurring solids** (that means people did not make them). They are also inorganic, which

means they do not come from plants or animals. Minerals can be found cemented together inside rocks. The internal structure of a mineral follows a well-organized pattern. Common examples of minerals are quartz and diamond, they have very perfect patterns.
