New residential development fails to impress.

Report by our architecture correspondent

The town council has described Victory Mansions, the new block of flats

(1) in the middle (2) of the town as 'an important (3)

addition to the town's residential facilities'. Your correspondent was invited to attend the opening ceremony, which promised to be a really fun (4) event.

The ceremony itself was a rather downbeat affair. Nobody present was impressed by the building, which didn't look particularly nice (5), with its grey concrete façade and rather dated look (6). Unfortunately, the initial impression didn't change when we were shown the inside. The rooms were not only small but, thanks to the 'environmentally-friendly sound-proofing' wood (7) on the walls, rather dark. The architects had tried to make (8) a garden place (9) on the roof, but it was so small that it could probably only comfortably accommodate five or six residents at any one time.

All in all, a big disappointment. And with prices starting at £500,000 for a two-room flat, you would have to be very rich (10) to even consider living there.
