

Using the Right Pronoun

- **Subject pronouns** are used as the subject of the sentence. They tell whom or what the sentence is about.
- **Object pronouns** are placed after action verbs or after the words *to, for, with, in,* and *at*.
- **You** and **it** can be subject pronouns or object pronouns.
