

- There will be a party.
- It will not rain.
- Will she pass the test?

We use **will** to talk about the future when we want to say what we think will happen.

It is often used for predictions.

Structure:

- **Affirmative:** Subject + *will* + base verb
Example: She will be late.
- **Negative:** Subject + *will not* (*won't*) + base verb
Example: It won't snow tomorrow.
- **Question:** *Will* + subject + base verb?
Example: Will they win the game?

💡 We often use "will" with words like "tomorrow", "next week", or "soon".




