THE EFFECT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY ON EDUCATION

Education is another area of social life in which information technology is changing the way we communicate. Today's college students may not simply sit in a lecture or a library to learn about their field. Through their computers and the wonders of virtual reality they can participate in lifelike simulated experiences. Consider the following scenario of the future of education made possible through developments in information technology. For children over the age of 10, daily attendance at schools is not **compulsory**. Some of the older children attend school only once or twice a week to get tutorial support or instruction from a teacher. For the most part, pupils are encouraged to work online from home. Students should complete a minimum number of study hours per year; however, they may make up these hours by studying at home at times that suit their family schedule. They can log on early or late in the day and even join live classes in other countries. In order to ensure that each student is learning adequately, computer software will automatically monitor the number of hours a week each student studies online as well as that student's learning materials and assessment activities. Reports will be available for parents and teachers. The software can then identify the best learning activities and conditions for each individual student and generate similar activities. **It** can be also identifying areas of week achievement and produce special programs adjusted to the students' needs.

In the future, cities will need to make sustainable development the most important thing. In other words, cities must grow in a good way and not damage the environment. People who manage cities in the future will have to consider a large number of things, including transportation, energy use, green spaces, and housing. All of these will need to be improved to make future cities pleasant places to live.

Smart systems will run successful future cities, including self-driving vehicles powered by eco-friendly fuels, such as electricity produced by solar panels or wind power. Transportation by car within the city will actually be faster than now, because there will be less **congestion**. A lot more people will commute to and from work on subway systems and in buses with their own lanes. Most trucks will disappear from city streets because delivery of goods will be by drone.

Successful future cities will have a lot more green spaces than today, which will improve air quality and reduce, to some extent, the worst effects of climate change. Research has shown that green spaces improve mental health as well as physical health, so the people who live in these cities will generally be happier than today. Although **it** will be expensive, new parks must be built. In addition, green spaces will also be put on top of buildings, private and public, and trees will be planted alongside all streets.

Future cities must provide enough affordable housing inside the cities themselves, not on the outskirts. This should be achieved by building higher and higher, or deep into the ground, or by converting old factories. It should not be achieved by allowing future cities to spread in all directions, converting farmland and open spaces into housing.
