



La Boca, Buenos Aires

La Boca is a colorful neighborhood of Buenos Aires, Argentina. When many people moved there from an Italian city in the 19th century, they had little money. They built their homes with thin metal pieces and coated them with leftover paint. That is why La Boca has such colorful houses. The streets of La Boca are famous for their tango dancers and street vendors.



Tetsugaku-no-michi, Kyoto

Tetsugaku-no-michi is a 1.2-mile-long street in Kyoto, Japan. It runs alongside a canal near Ginkaku-ji (Temple of the Silver Pavilion), a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It is one of the most pleasant walks in Kyoto. This street is especially well known for its beautiful scenery and cherry blossoms in the spring.



Lombard Street, San Francisco

Lombard Street is located in San Francisco, California, USA. It has eight sharp turns. It was designed that way to slow cars down on its steep hill. The sign recommends people to drive at 5 mph (8 km/h). This street overlooks the city and gives you wonderful views of downtown.
