Tower Bridge is one of the most famous bridges in the world. It was designed by architect Horace Jones and completed in 1894. About 11,000 tons of steel were used to build its 265-meter-long frame. Today, Tower Bridge is one of London's top tourist attractions.

Taking photographs of the bridge is a popular activity. Visitors can also go inside and enjoy stunning views of London from the walkways between the towers.

In 2014, glass floors were added to the walkways, giving people a new way to experience the bridge. The floors, over 40 meters above the River Thames, let visitors look down at the traffic and boats passing below. It's especially exciting to see the bridge open and close beneath your feet.
