## Remember!

POSITIVE	EXAMPLE
I + <b>verb</b> → don't change	I get up at eight o'clock.
He/She + <b>verb</b> → CHANGE → <b>Add</b> <b>-S</b> <b>-ES</b> <b>-IES</b>	He <b>goes</b> to school at seven o'clock.

NEGATIVE	EXAMPLE
I + don't + verb	I don't get up at eight o'clock
He/She + doesn't + verb	He doesn't go to school at seven o'clock.
<b>Verb doesn't change</b>	

QUESTION	EXAMPLE
Do + I + verb ...?	Do I get up at eight o'clock?
Yes, I do.	Yes, I do.
No, I don't.	No, I don't.
Does + he/she + verb ...?	Does he go to school at seven o'clock?
Yes, he/she does.	Yes, he does.
No, he/she doesn't.	No, he doesn't.
