A. EXTRA GRAMMAR: Present simple (*Hiện tại đơn*)

- **Cách dùng:**

+ Diễn tả **hành động thường xuyên**, lặp đi lặp lại trong hiện tại (hàng ngày, mỗi tuần, luôn luôn, ...)

+ Diễn tả **sự thật hiển nhiên**, chân lý.

+ Diễn tả **thói quen, sở thích, nghề nghiệp**.

+ Diễn tả **lịch trình cố định** (thời gian biểu, giờ tàu xe,...).

- **Dấu hiệu nhận biết:** thường đi với các **trạng từ chỉ tần suất** như *always, usually, often, sometimes, never, every day, once a week, at 10 o'clock, in the morning, ...*

- **Công thức:**

(+)	S + V (s/es)	I play football every day.
(-)	S + don't/doesn't + V	She doesn't like coffee.
(?)	Do/Does + S + V? → Yes, S + do/does . → No, S + don't/doesn't .	Does he work in the office? → Yes, he does . → No, he doesn't .

Note: S = subject: chủ ngữ; V = Verb: động từ; V (s/es) = Verb (s/es) động từ thêm đuôi s/es;
don't = do not; doesn't = does not


