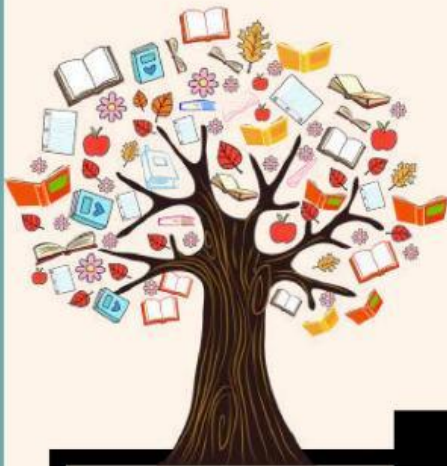

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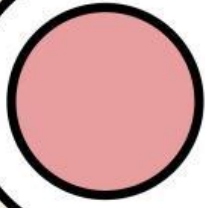
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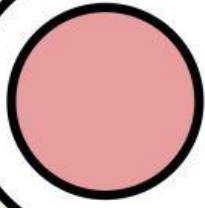




Competency Achievement and Learning Objectives

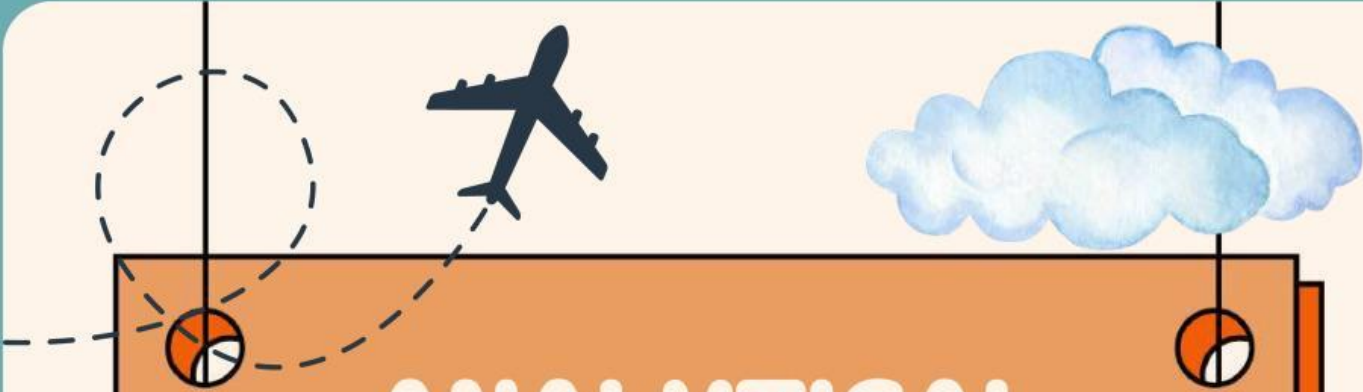

However, the benefits of social media are joined with notable risks. The extends use of social media has shown to contribute to mental health issues in youth, such as anxiety and depression. Data reveals that in Indonesia, about 27% of adolescents experience clinical symptoms of depression reportedly correlated with excessive social media use. The constant exposure to idealized lives portrayed online can lead to negative self-image and feelings of inadequacy among young users, worsen mental health problems.
