- 1 We use *be going to* + infinitive to talk about future plans or intentions.
- 2 We also use *be going to* + infinitive to make a prediction when we know or can see that something is going to happen, e.g.
*It's winter there so it's **going to be** cold.*
*Look at that car! It's **going to crash**.*
