People often don't think about the water they drink. However, it's a very different story if we are travelling abroad. In some countries, the water is simply not safe to drink. So, you must get all the relevant information. [I] Try to learn anything you can about the water situation of the place where you are travelling.

The water you need to worry about is water that could be dirty. Unsafe water does not actually mean it will kill you. Local people can drink the water where they live and are fine because their bodies are used to it. [II] Even a tiny amount can have unpleasant results. On your trips, it's best to ask the locals about the quality of the tap water. These are the people who are living there, so they are your best guide.

[III] If the water is unsafe, there will usually be notice in your room. This also means you should not clean your teeth with tap water. And, of course, don't take any pills with it. Use bottled water instead. Another danger, of course, could be swimming. Check that natural water lakes and rivers are safe before you swim. And don't open your mouth when swimming! [IV] It's the same as tap water!
