Madagascar is the fourth largest island in the world. It is located in the Indian Ocean off the southeastern coast of Africa. The country is quite poor and most people earn less than \$2 a day. However, there is growing interest in the country for tourism, but at the moment very few tourists visit. Madagascar has something special which makes it very interesting for scientists and tourists alike. It has many species of plants and animals that do not exist in other countries. Between 80 and 90 percent of its animals and plants have only ever been found in Madagascar.

People have lived in Madagascar for a very long time. Most researchers believe that the first people came to the island over 2000 years ago from Borneo in the South China Sea. However, since then Arabs and East Africans, and later Malays, Javanese, Indians, Chinese and Europeans have all lived in Madagascar. The population has risen to over 20 million people and this has caused many environmental **issues**.

Nearly fifty percent of Madagascar's forests have disappeared in the last fifty years. It is even higher on the coast. Scientists have estimated that nearly 50 per cent of **its** animal and plant species are dead or will die. Madagascar's most famous animal is the lemur. Unfortunately, at least 17 species of lemur have become extinct since people arrived. Many plants and animals we know little about will be dead before we have a chance to know more about them.
