

Chapter 2: The Donkey and the load of Salt

Summary

- Long ago there lived a merchant who sells salt.
- His donkey carries the salt to other villages.
- One day the donkey accidentally falls into a stream, and the salt dissolves, making his load lighter.
- Next time, he intentionally falls to make his load light again.
- The merchant notices the donkey's trick and decides to teach him a lesson.
- The merchant loads the donkey with cotton instead of salt.
- When the donkey falls into the stream, the cotton absorbs water and becomes very heavy.
- The donkey struggles with the heavy load and stops playing tricks.
- He learns that cheating doesn't work forever.
- Moral: "You can fool someone a few times, but not always."

Hindi Translation

अध्याय के बारे में: यह कहानी एक व्यापारी और उसके गधे की है। इसमें, गधा अपने मालिक को अपने आराम के लिए कई बार बेवकूफ बनाता है, लेकिन जब मालिक को उसकी चाल समझ में आती है, तो वह भी उसे सबक सिखाता है। आइए, कहानी पढ़ते हैं और जानते हैं कि वह सबक क्या था।

बहुत समय पहले की बात है। एक व्यापारी रहता था। वह नमक बेचने का काम करता था। उसके पास एक गधा था जो नमक का बोझ ढोता था। व्यापारी गधे पर नमक लादकर दूसरे गाँव में बेचने जाता था। रास्ते में एक नदी पार करनी पड़ती थी।

एक दिन, गधा नदी में गिर गया। नमक पानी में घुल गया, और बोझ हल्का हो गया। गधा आसानी से नदी पार कर गया और खुश हुआ।

अगली बार, गधे ने जानबूझकर नदी में गिरने की चाल चली। व्यापारी को उसकी चालाकी पर शक हुआ। तीसरी बार, गधे ने फिर वही चाल चली। अब व्यापारी को यकीन हो गया कि गधा जानबूझकर ऐसा कर रहा है। अगले दिन, व्यापारी ने गधे पर नमक की जगह रुई लाद दी। गधा फिर नदी में गिरा, लेकिन इस बार रुई ने पानी सोख लिया और बोझ बहुत भारी हो गया।
