**Famous Film Festivals Around the World**

Film festivals usually screen films from different countries and cultures. There are several famous annual film festivals around the world.

The Cannes Film Festival was founded in 1946. (1) It is held every year in Cannes, France in May. It screens new films and documentaries from around the world.

Another well-known festival is the Sundance Film Festival. It is held in Utah, America. It has been held every year in January since 1978. It showcases new films by American and international independent film makers. (2)

The Berlin International Film Festival is one of the world's leading festivals. It is an annual event usually held in February. (3) Other events organised include film trade fairs, lectures and workshops. Around 20,000 professionals from over 130 countries attend the festival.

The oldest film festival is the Venice Film Festival. (4) It takes place either in late August or September. Even though it is held in the island of Lido in Venice, films are screened in the famous Palazzo del Cinema and other nearby venues.

Anne is mistakenly sent to live with two middle-aged siblings – Marilla and Matthew Cuthbert. (6) They originally wanted to adopt a boy but they accept Anne into their home. The story is about Anne's life with the siblings, in school and with the townsfolk.

Anne is an imaginative, fanciful and dramatic girl. She is talkative especially about her dreams.
