Brighten up Meaning: If the weather brightens up, it becomes lighter and less cloudy, with more sun. Used when clouds disappear, and the sun starts shining. Examples: <i>Weather:</i> "Don't worry, the sky will brighten up by afternoon!"	Cloud over Meaning: To become covered with clouds; metaphorically, it can mean becoming gloomy or troubled. Describes sudden changes in weather (e.g., before rain) or a negative shift in a situation/mood. Examples: <i>Weather:</i> "It was sunny, but the sky clouded over in minutes."	Clear up Meaning: To become sunny after bad weather; can also mean resolving confusion or a problem. Used when clouds/rain disappear, or misunderstandings are solved. Examples: <i>Weather:</i> "The rain stopped, and the sky cleared up beautifully."

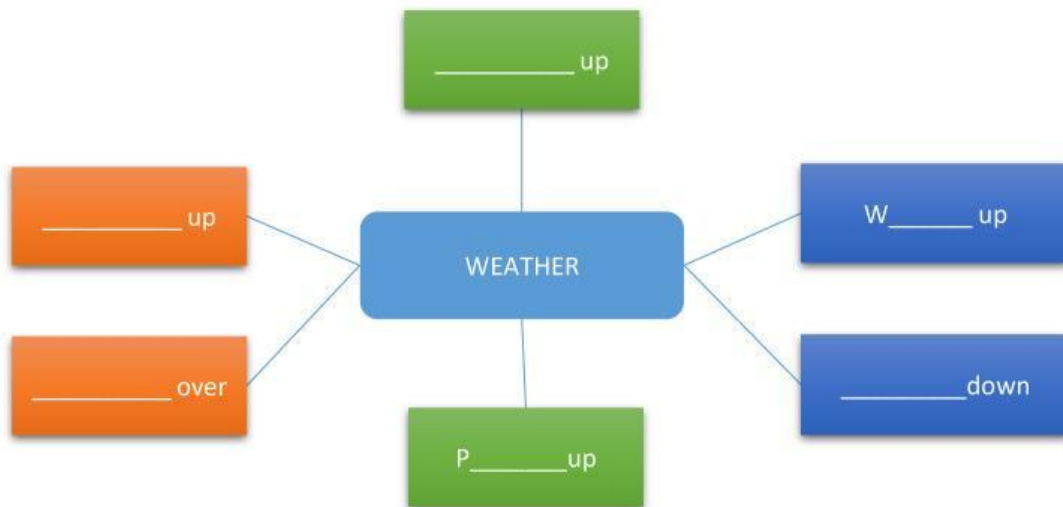
Here's your weather update for the next few days! On Friday morning, the sky will start to **brighten up** after some early clouds, bringing sunshine by midday. However, don't put away your umbrella just yet—by afternoon, it might **cloud over** again, with a chance of light showers.

In the evening, temperatures will **cool down** significantly, so grab a jacket if you're heading out. Overnight, the rain will stop, and the skies should **clear up** completely, making it perfect for stargazing.

Saturday morning will **warm up** quickly, reaching a pleasant 20°C. But keep an eye out: by late afternoon, clouds may return, and there's a small risk of thunderstorms. Don't worry though—Sunday is expected to **brighten up** again, with sunny skies all day!

Remember, even if the weather tries to **cloud over** your plans, stay prepared and enjoy your weekend!
