

PASSIVE FORM OF PRESENT TENSE (PRESENT SIMPLE, PRESENT PROGRESSIVE AND PRESENT PERFECT)

1 – Grammar Structures and Explanation:

- Present simple:

Recognize this tense: *always, usually, often, sometimes, never, Every day/week/month, on Mondays, at night...*

Active form: S + V (s/es) +...

❖ I/We/They + V

❖ He/She/It + V(s/es)

Add “es” at the end if the verb has “s, sh, ch, z, x, o” at the end

Examples: brush -> brushes, wish -> wishes, watch -> watches, go -> goes...

Ex: She **brushes** her teeth every day.

Add “s”: others

Ex: He **comes** to English class at 3PM every Monday.

Passive form: the grammatical subject expresses the theme of the main verb

S + am/is/are + Ved/3...+ (by agent) + time

Ex: Active: Helen makes **this cake**.

⇒ Passive: **This cake** is made by Helen.

- Present progressive:

Recognize this tense: *at the moment, at present, now, right now*

Active form: S+ am/is/are + V-ing

❖ I am + V-ing

Ex: I **am doing** homework now.

❖ He/She/It + is + V-ing

Ex: He **is writing** an essay at the moment

She **is making** a cake at present.

❖ We/They + are + V-ing

Ex: We **are going** to the beach

They **are building** a house.

Passive form: S + am/is/are + being + Ved/3 + (by agent) + time

Examples:

This building **is being built** by Mr. Johnson.

This cake **is being made** by Lucy.

- Present perfect:

Recognize this tense: *already, before, for + time (for 2 years, for a decade), since + period of time (since I was 10, since I was young, since 2010...), so far, yet*

Active form: S + have/has + Ved/3

❖ I/You/We/They + have + Ved/3

Example:

I **have learned** English for over 10 years.

We **have been** friends since we were 10.

❖ She/He/It + has + Ved/3

She **has walked** in the street for an hour.

He **has solved** Jim's problem so far.

Passive form: S + have/has + been + Ved/3 + (by agent) + time

Example:

The bicycle **has been sold** for Tom.

A suitable job **has been offered** to John.

The new students **have been chosen** by Miss Kate.
