 **Grammar Focus: Narrative Tenses (Past Simple, Past Continuous, Past Perfect)**

Target: Using narrative tenses to build atmosphere, show sequence, and emphasize backstory

 **Grammar Explanation**

When telling stories or describing past events in detail, especially in suspenseful or literary writing, we often use a **mix of narrative tenses**:

1. Past Simple – for the main events or actions

 *She stepped off the train. He asked her name.*

2. Past Continuous – for background actions or atmosphere

 *Rain was falling. He was standing in the shadows.*

3. Past Perfect – to show an earlier past or backstory

 *She had changed her plans. No one had known she was arriving.*

When do we use which tense?

Tense	Use	Example
Past Simple	Main actions in the story, one after another	<i>She entered the station and looked around.</i>
Past Continuous	Describes the scene or interrupted actions	<i>The rain was falling as she walked.</i>
Past Perfect	Action that happened before another past action	<i>She had already bought the ticket before she changed her mind.</i>

From the story:

"The clock **had just struck** eleven when Naomi **stepped** off the late train."

"She **had changed** her travel plans last minute."

"A security guard **was walking** his beat."
