The impact of bullying on mental health!

Bullying has severe and lasting effects on a person's mental health, often leaving victims feeling isolated and broken-hearted. Many who suffer from bullying lose self-confidence, leading them to withdraw from social interactions. They may become loners or introverts, avoiding situations where they fear harsh judgement. This isolation can deepen feelings of sadness, increasing the risk of depression and anxiety. Victims may also feel aggressive impulses, potentially becoming rebels as they struggle to cope with their emotions. The emotional toll of bullying often leaves individuals feeling overwhelmed, finding daily life challenging. A lack of sympathy and support from peers or family members makes

their struggles for recovery harder. In severe cases, bullying can contribute to suicidal ideation and behaviors, as victims feel trapped with no escape from their pain. Over time, victims of bullying may develop a negative view of themselves and others, making it difficult to trust people or form meaningful relationships. Instead of being sociable, they may shy away from opportunities to connect with others. It is essential to foster understanding and provide support for those affected by bullying, creating an environment where empathy and kindness embrace.
