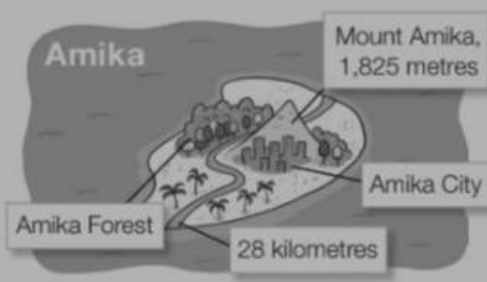

The Amazon is a river in South America. It is **6 400** kilometres long. A lot of animals live in the river. There are river dolphins, crabs, and **2100** different species of fish.

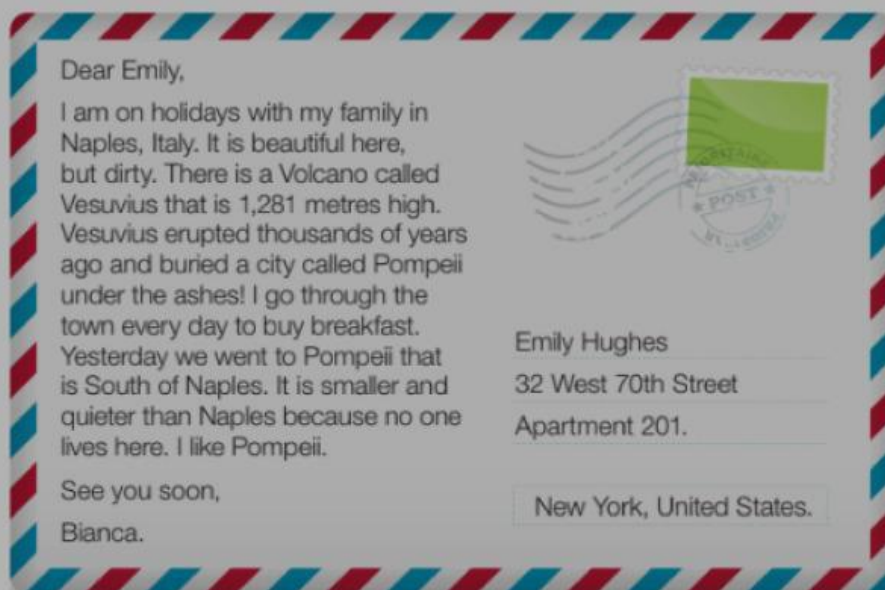
