THE ART OF PARKOUR

Parkour started in France in the 1980s. created by Raymond Belle and later developed by his son David Belle. It is based on military obstacle course training. The main idea of parkour is to move from one place to another in the most creative way possible, using movements like running, jumping, climbing, or swinging. Parkour is more of a philosophy than a sport, encouraging people to explore their environment and find their own paths through obstacles.

Parkour can be done alone or in groups. A famous group called the Yamasaki formed in the late 1980s, promoting values like humility and teamwork. They avoided showing off and followed strict rules to stay true to the art of parkour.

Parkour focuses on breaking mental and physical **barriers**. **It** teaches people how to move through their environment and **develop** self-discipline. The founder believed parkour should not be a competition but a way to grow as an individual.

Although gyms offer classes, many practitioners prefer to practice freely in outdoor spaces. Parkour is also known as free running, which focuses more on personal expression. Both activities are similar, and the term free running is often used interchangeably with parkour.
