

WHOSE

(De quién) o (a quién le pertenece)

WHOSE investigates possession, so we need to remember **the possessive adjectives, possessive nouns and the possessive pronouns.**

PERSONAL PRONOUNS	POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES	POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS
I	my	mine
You	your	yours
We	our	ours
They	their	theirs
She	her	hers
He	his	his
It	its	its

To elaborate a question using **"whose"**, the first thing that we have to, do is to identify the possession and after that write **the noun** possessed next to whose.

Example:

Whose + noun



Possession	Question.
Paula's car.	Whose car?
Her car.	Whose car?
Fernando's car.	Whose car?
His car.	Whose car?



Possession	Question.
Paul's television.	Whose television?
His television.	Whose television?
Alba's television.	Whose television?
Her television.	Whose television?

HOW TO MAKE A WH QUESTION USING "WHOSE"

There are 2 manners to use "**whose**", one in the subject and one in the complement, but they have 2 different structures.

Structure in the subject.

Whose + noun + verb + complement?

Structure in the complement.

Whose + noun + aux + subject + verb + complement?

"WHOSE" IN THE SUBJECT.

When the possession is in the subject, you simply delete the possession and copy the sentence completely. (**whose + noun**)

WHOSE + noun + verb + complement + ?

Example:



Sentence:	Marco's mother drives a car to Ambato every month.
Identify the possession:	Marco's mother
Whose + noun=	Whose mother
Question:	Whose mother drives a car to Ambato every month?

"WHOSE" IN THE COMPLEMENT.

When the possession is in the complement, you need to use auxiliaries. **"DO-DOES"**

Structure for "whose" in the complement:

Whose + noun + aux (do -does)



I like Kelly's bear.

Whose bear do you like?

Remember that after **whose** (in the complement), you always use a noun and an aux -(do / does).
then use subject, verb, complement and question mark.

WHOSE + noun + aux (do/does) + subject + verb + complement + ?

Remember to keep the preposition if it is present in the sentence.

It is recommendable to use the **preposition** at the beginning of the question.

Preposition + WHOSE + noun + aux (do/does) + subject + verb + complement + ?
