

Time

You can ask for the time in two ways:
What time is it? OR **What's the time?**

For times which are not multiples of five, we use **minutes**, e.g. 6.03 = **It's three minutes past six**.

When you can't be exact, use **about**:
'What time do you get up?'
'At about 7.00.'


Normally /'nɔ:mlɪ/ is the same as usually.
